## EXECUTIVE ORDER

## BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia should maintain a goal of consistently paying its vendors in a

prompt and efficient manner for goods and services provided to the state; and

WHEREAS: State paperwork associated with the payment of bills should be reduced wherever

possible, including, but not limited to, the receipt of invoices from contractors/vendors

electronically: and

WHEREAS: State prompt payment of bills should ensure the expanded interest of businesses to

contract with the state, provide better prices to the state through increased competitive

bidding and ultimately save taxpayer dollars.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR

OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That the Executive Order of May 2,1991, establishing the Prompt Payment policy shall be

RESCINDED and shall instead be addressed by policy of the State Accounting Office

(SAO).

IT IS FURTHER

**ORDERED:** That all state agencies, departments, and institutions shall make payments to

contractors/vendors consistent with payment terms.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: That all state agencies, departments, and institutions shall utilize electronic

disbursement methods, consistent with O.C.G.A. 50-5B-3(3), for payments to

contractors/vendors when practical.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: That prompt payment discounts are an effective tool that provides additional savings to

the state and should be taken from the total invoice amount and are in addition to any

other volume or other discounts negotiated.
